

Montana Conservation Corps Contributes to Reclamation's Lower Marias Unit


The Bureau of Reclamation and the Montana Conservation Corps (MCC) in Billings, completed a recreation enhancement project around Tiber Dam and Lake Elwell, near Chester, Montana.

The MCC, a non-profit organization, had the mission to equip young people with life tools while they complete projects of lasting benefit to the environment and communities of Montana and neighboring regions. During the sign project, this five-person crew camped at Reclamation's Sanford Park recreation area. New directional and recreation area identification signs were installed through the cooperative efforts of Reclamation and MCC. A total of 24 signs were successfully installed around the area. On the last day of the project, a brief history of the Tiber Dam and Lake Elwell area was presented to the crew, followed by a discussion of the benefits of their participation in the project.

The project was made possible through the hard work and dedication of Reclamation Montana Area Office staff, Reclamation Tiber Field Office staff and Montana Conservation Corps crew members. These new signs will enhance the recreation experience of visitors to Tiber Dam and Lake Elwell.
