

## **DEPUTY REGIONAL DIRECTOR GARY CAMPBELL**



Gary Campbell serves as a Deputy Regional Director of the Great Plains Region, the largest and most ecologically diverse region in Reclamation. In conjunction with the Regional Director, he directs a work force, which strives to manage, develop, and protect water and related resources in an environmentally and economically sound manner.

Campbell joined the Great Plains Region in October 2005. Prior to his assignment here, he served as the Deputy Director of Engineering for the U.S. Forest Service in Washington, D.C. Campbell entered Federal Service in September 1981 with the U.S. Forest Service at Big Horn National Forest, Sheridan, Wyo. Since then, he has served in progressively responsible positions throughout the West, including Forest Engineer on the Humboldt National Forest, Nev. and Regional Engineering Budget Coordinator for the Forest Service's Intermountain Region, based in Ogden, Utah.

He was recognized in 1998 as the Intermountain Regional Engineer of the Year. Campbell completed the Harvard Senior Executive Fellowship program in 2002. He also completed the Senior Executive Service Candidate Development Program in 2004. In 2008, Campbell was awarded a U.S. Department of the Interior Superior Service Honor Award, for developing and fostering effective collaborative power customer relationships within the Great Plains Region.

Campbell received his bachelor's degree from the University of Wyoming in civil engineering and is a registered professional engineer.

Reclamation is the largest wholesale water supplier and the second largest producer of hydroelectric power in the United States, with operations and facilities in the 17 Western States.
