Daniel S. Fritz serves as the Resource Services Program Manager for the Great Plains Region. As such, Fritz is responsible for the region's environmental compliance, land and resource services, water resources and planning and hydrology.

He ensures compliance with environmental laws, regulations and policy management. He manages agreements with other government agencies involving land which surrounds Reclamation's various dam's, reservoirs, and facilities. Fritz works in recreation management and maintenance of land records, acquisitions of land, exchanges of land, and rights-of-way for the use of roads and facilities. His office oversees archaeology, cultural resources, endangered species, and compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act. Fritz also manages the hydrology group which studies the movement, distribution, and quality of water throughout various Reclamation projects.

Fritz assumed the helm as the Resource Services Program Manager in February 2008. Fritz has worked at four of the five regions in Reclamation, including the Lower Colorado Region, the Upper Colorado Region, the Mid-Pacific Region, and the Great Plains Region. Prior to joining Reclamation in 1986, he spent nine years working for the U.S. Forest Service in Wyoming, Utah, and Arizona.

During Fritz's tenure with Reclamation, he has received numerous performance awards recognizing his valuable efforts in the area of resource management and mitigation of various environmental issues.

Fritz earned a Bachelor's of Science Degree in Forest Management from Utah State University in Logan, Utah.

Reclamation is the largest wholesale water supplier and the second largest producer of hydroelectric power in the United States, with operations and facilities in the 17 Western States.
