CURRENT RESERVOIR CONDITIONS

Elevation: 3620.76 Storage: 835,859 acre-feet; River Release: 3,250 cfs; Inflow: 3,590 cfs;

GENERAL COMMENTS:

Snowpack in the Bighorn River Basin continues to increase and is currently about 115 percent of average. Inflow into Bighorn Lake has increased to over 3,500 cfs. Based on the April water supply forecast, releases to the Bighorn River need to be increased to control the rate of fill of storage in Bighorn Lake. In response, the following operation is required at Yellowtail Dam and Powerplant.

YELLOWTAIL TURBINE RELEASE:

At 0800 hour on Friday, April 8, 2011:

Increase average daily turbine release to 3,680 cfs (\approx 2,250 MW-Hrs/day using 39.2 cfs/mw).

AFTERBAY RELEASE AND OPERATION:

At 0800 hour on Friday, April 8, 2011:

Maintain diversions to the Bighorn Canal at 0 cfs.

Increase river release to 3,750 cfs (gage height = 60.96 with -0.06 shift).

Increase total release from the Afterbay to 3,750 cfs.
