CURRENT RESERVOIR CONDITIONS:

Elevation: 3627.53 Storage: 936,441 acre-feet; River Release: 2,370 cfs; Inflow: 2,170 cfs;

GENERAL COMMENTS:

The algae growth in the Bighorn River continues to rapidly decrease. To more accurately account for maintaining actual river flows at 2,370 cfs, new river shifts should be applied to the river stage and the following operation changes made at Yellowtail Dam, Powerplant, and Afterbay. **Due to the National Holiday on November 11, implementation of the shift previously scheduled for November 11 at 0800 hour is hereby re-scheduled for implementation on November 10 at 1630 hour.**

YELLOWTAIL TURBINE RELEASE:

At 0800 hour on Wednesday, November 10, 2010:

Maintain average daily turbine release at 2,300 cfs (\approx 1,555 MW-Hrs/day using 35.5 cfs/mw).

At 1630 hour on Wednesday, November 10, 2010:

Maintain average daily turbine release at 2,300 cfs (\approx 1,555 MW-Hrs/day using 35.5 cfs/mw).

AFTERBAY RELEASE AND OPERATION:

At 0800 hour on Wednesday, November 10, 2010:

Maintain diversions to the Bighorn Canal at 0 cfs.

Maintain river release at 2,370 cfs (decrease gage height to 60.54 & apply new shift of -0.64).

Maintain total release from the Afterbay at 2,370 cfs.

At 1630 hour on Wednesday, November 10, 2010:

Maintain diversions to the Bighorn Canal at 0 cfs.

Maintain river release at 2,370 cfs (decrease gage height to 60.42 & apply new shift of -0.52).

Maintain total release from the Afterbay at 2,370 cfs.
