


New Melones Lake Trail Map





Trail Difficulty Ratings

Easy – less than 2 miles (3.2 km) in length with no more than 200 feet (61 m) of elevation change.

Moderate – more than 2 miles (3.2 km) in length or an elevation change between 200 and 400 feet (61 to 122 m).

Challenging – more than 4 miles (6.4 km) in length or an elevation change of more than 400 feet (122 m).

H = Hiking

B = Biking

E = Equestrian

Degrees, Minutes

Black Bear Loop	TT	37.59.139, -120.30.341	easy	H, B	Experience oak woodland vegetation on this gently rolling trail.
Buck Brush Loop	GH	38.02.053, -120.54.823	easy	H, B	Great fishing access with views of Angels Creek.
Carson Creek	GH	38.00.732, -120.32.010	moderate	H, B	Long, flat trail with great views and shoreline access.
Cougar Point	TT	37.59.139, -120.30.341	easy	H, B	This trail provides fishing access to Mormon Creek.
Fox Ravine	TT	37.88.772, -120.30.337	easy	H, B	A short path which meanders through oak and grass woodlands.
Frontier	GH	38.01.811, -120.32.862	moderate	H, B	A fun bike or hike with many rolling hills.
Gold Rush	GH	38.00.745, -120.32.037	moderate	H, B	Use this trail for hiking, biking, or to access fishing areas.
Green Springs	PW	37.55.424, -120.31.666	moderate	H, B, E	View unique plant life on the slopes of Peoria Mountain.
Heron Point	TT	37.59.281, -120.30.965	easy	H, B	Foothill vegetation changes from shady groves to manzanita dappled hills.
Kingsnake Loop	TT	37.58.771, -120.30.351	easy	H, B	This short loop is great for bird watching and other animal viewing.
Natural Bridges	NB	38.03.120, -120.28.285	moderate	H, B	A must see. Coyote Creek flowing through marble caves. Sorry, no pets allowed.
Norwegian Gulch	MT	38.00.217, -120.29.268	easy	H	An easy hike which begins behind our visitor center.
Peoria Mountain	PW	37.55.424, -120.31.666	challenging	H, B, E	This trail provides fantastic views of the Stanislaus River Canyon.
Peoria Ridge	PW	37.55.424, -120.31.666	moderate	H, B, E	Follow a rambling track with views of Table Mountain and Sierra snowy peaks.
Redtail	TT	30.58.895, -120.30.872	easy	H, B	Experience a foothill pine forest on this easy hiking trail.
Ringneck Run	TT	37.58.866, -120.30.867	easy	H, B	An easy connection between the fish cleaning station and boat launch parking lot.
Table Mountain	TM	37.55.953, -120.27.754	challenging	H	Unique geology, vernal pools, panoramic views, and a challenging last ¼ mile.
Tower Climb	GH	38.00.908, -120.31.523	challenging	H, B	An exciting bicycle and hiking trail with great views.

New Melones Lake Rules and Regulations

Camping

- Standard campsites are limited to 2 vehicles and 8 people.
- Walk-in campsites are limited to 1 vehicle and 4 people.
- Camping is limited to 14 days in a 30-day period.
- Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. until 8 a.m.
- No generators, music or loud noise during quiet hours.
- You are responsible for the cleanliness of your campsite.
- Camping is permitted in designated campgrounds only.
- Shoreline camping is prohibited.
- Camping fees must be paid within 30 minutes of occupying a campsite.

Vehicle Use

- Recreation area entrance gates are closed at night during the posted hours.
- Vehicle entry after the gates are closed is prohibited. Exit at any time.
- The California Vehicle Code prohibits passengers in truck beds and towed boats.
- Vehicles and trailers are limited to paved roads and parking areas.
- The maximum speed limit is 10 mph in the campgrounds and day use areas.

Fires

- Campfires are only allowed in fire rings or grills in designated areas.
- Do not leave fires unattended.
- Collecting dead and down wood for campfires is permitted.

Pets

- Pets must be on a maximum six foot leash at all times.
- Do not leave your pets unattended.

Firearms

- Loaded firearms, including bb guns, are prohibited in the recreation areas.
- Target shooting and hunting are prohibited in the recreation areas.

All Federal, State, and County laws are enforced.
