Canada geese are the most widely distributed waterfowl across North America. They range from the Atlantic to Pacific coast and from Mexico to the Arctic coast of Canada.

There are at least twelve sub-species of Canada geese, five of which are found in California.

Canada geese have an interesting social structure. Large flocks of geese consist of sub-flocks, which are composed of families. Families are made up of paired adults and their young. Large flocks have the highest social rank; larger families dominate smaller families, and pairs dominate single birds.
