Project	Proposed Activity	Funding
Cunningham Ranch	Acquisition of a conservation easement on approximately 3,800 acres of vernal pool studded grassland along the eastern border of Merced County. Rare species observed on the property include California tiger salamander, western burrowing owl, succulent owls clover and shining navarretia.	\$480,000
Farmington Property	Acquisition of 960 acres of vernal pool/grassland complex in eastern San Joaquin County, preserving suitable habitat for vernal pool fairy and tadpole shrimp, succulent owls clover, Hoover's spurge, San Joaquin and slender orcutt grasses and Greene's tuctoria.	\$250,000
Fenwood Property	Acquisition of a conservation easement on 2,180 acres of blue oak woodland (92%), grassland (4%) riparian habitat (3%), vernal pool and willow scrub (1%) along the Sacramento River in Shasta County. This project will protect bank swallow, willow flycatcher, bald eagle and valley elderberry longhorn beetle habitat as well as habitat for numerous other plant and animal species.	\$300,000
Mt. Hamilton (Romero Ranch)	Fencing of riparian corridors to promote regeneration of sycamore alluvial woodland and restore and protect habitat for many sensitive species including the California red-legged frog, foothill yellow-legged frog, California tiger salamander, western pond turtle and San Joaquin roach.	\$175,000
Pine Hills Reserve	Acquisition of priority gabbroic soils northern mixed chaparral habitat within the Cameron Park and Salmon Falls Units of the Pine Hill Ecological Reserve in El Dorado County.	\$250,000
Riparian Wood Rat	Conduct a study of the ecological interaction of black rats and riparian woodrats at Caswell MSP. The study primarily seeks to determine whether recruitment of woodrats differs in areas where black rats are controlled compared to areas where black rats are not controlled. To test this hypothesis, habitat use and population ecology of both species will be investigated.	\$89,654
Tivy Mtn: Carter Property Keck's Checkerbloom	Acquisition of 40 acres adjacent to land previously purchased for the protection of Keck's checkerbloom on Tivy Mountain in Fresno County.	\$62,500
Allensworth Fencing	Purchase fencing material	\$12,000
Riparian Brush Rabbit	Captive propagation	\$23,000
Tivy Mtn: Beach 47 property	Acquisition of 57 acres on Tivy Mountain in Fresno County for the protection of Keck's checkerbloom.	\$122,000
BR Reg. Office Admin.	Includes salary for Regional office personnel	\$184,000
BR Area Office Admin	Includes salary for field office personnel who are lead on several projects.	\$39,395
