Ben Brown Ranch Vernal Pool habitat	Conservation easement initiated in FY01 on approximately 390 acres of vernal pool studded grassland in southern Sacramento County to protect listed vernal pool invertebrates.	\$70,000
Butte County Vernal Pools	Acquisition of 264 acres of habitat for listed vernal pool invertebrates and Butte County meadowfoam	\$325,000
Chico Landing	Restoration of 161 acres of riparian habitat to provide feeding and resting habitat for neotropical migrant birds, ecosystem biodiversity, and flood protection	\$257,000
Cowell Ranch	Fee title for protection of 3,650 acres of vernal pool/grassland/riparian habitat and associated listed and sensitive species	\$495,000
Deer Creek	Acquisition of 2,054 acres of grassland/vernal pool, oak hardwood, and riparian habitat to protect listed vernal pool species and neotropical migrant birds	\$250,000
Kit Fox/Coyote Interactions	Evaluate the response by coyotes to cattle grazing within the range of San Joaquin kit foxes and develop management guidelines	\$60,000
Large-Flowered Fiddleneck	Survey, monitor, and develop a management plan to recover large-flowered fiddleneck on and adjacent to Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory	\$65,000
Riparian Brush Rabbit	Additional funds needed for construction of captive reproduction pens.	\$53,000
Riparian Brush Rabbit Caswell MSP	Fencing and fire management to protect and enhance habitat for riparian brush rabbit and riparian woodrat	\$155,320
Riparian Brush Rabbit	Emergency fire supplies to protect captive riparian brush rabbits	\$1,147
Toledo Basin Tricolored Blackbirds	Purchase and install pump to flood recharge 40-acre recharge basin to provide dependable nesting habitat for tricolored blackbirds.	\$28,000
Sun River Wetland Restoration	Restoration of 537 acres of wetland habitats to enhance habitat for giant garter snake, Valley elderberry longhorn beetle, shorebirds, and waterfowl adjacent to Stone Lakes NWR	\$285,000
Farmington Property **	Acquisition of 960 acres of vernal pool/grassland complex in eastern San Joaquin County, preserving suitable habitat for vernal pool fairy and tadpole shrimp, succulent owls clover, Hoover's spurge, San Joaquin and slender orcutt grasses and Greene's tuctoria. **(Deobg/reobg)	[\$175,000]
