The split and pull method of replacement will be used to install the new pipeline which will minimize ground disturbance. As a result, two 4'X4' pits at each end of the pipe are the only ground distribing activities within the 476' section of ROW.

The pipe location is on the north side of Wood Drive within the ROW for the L-Line Canal.

Reclamation will issue a consent letter for work within the ROW.

The proposed timeline for pipe replacement is October – November 2011.


