
Ongoing Restoration Projects on Colorado River

- **Other Various Projects on Reservations and Refuges**
- **Multi Species Conservation Plan (8000 Acres Total Plan)**





THE COLORADO RIVER AT YUMA


















Existing Historic Channel / Wetland Conditions










Comparison of Avian Density

Restoration

- **To Date over approximately 1000 acres of Native Cottonwood/Willow Forest Restored on Lower Colorado River**
- **Over 100% Increase in Amount of Native Cottonwood/Willow Habitat Since 1986 on the Lower Colorado River**
