


Great Plains Regional Managers

Regional Office Managers



Mike Ryan

Michael J. Ryan is the Regional Director of the Great Plains Region, his office is located at the Regional headquarters in Billings, Mont. He provides leadership for the management, development and protection of water and related resources in the vast nine-state region. This includes 80 Reclamation reservoirs, 21 power plants and 81 recreation areas averaging 14 million visitors a year. Reclamation facilities deliver drinking water to a rural and urban population of about 2.2 million people.



Gary Campbell

Gary Campbell serves as the Deputy Regional Director of the Great Plains Region located in Billings, Mont. He oversees the Area Offices and their work force which strives to manage, develop, and protect water and related resources in an environmentally and economically sound manner.



John Soucy

John Soucy serves as the Deputy Regional Director of the Great Plains Region, based in Billings, Mont. Soucy is responsible for infrastructure and engineering, business resources, human resources, information technology, public affairs, communication, Native American affairs, safety and occupational health, resource services and equal opportunity employment.



M. Sue McCannel

M. Sue McCannel is the Human Resources Officer for Reclamation's Great Plains Regional Office in Billings, Mont. Her department provides program administration and oversight in the following functional areas: position classification, staffing and recruitment, employee development, employee relations, security, labor relations, pay and leave administration, personnel records and actions, employee benefits and diversity initiatives as well as employee assistance, wellness and affirmative employment.



Timothy Flanagan

Timothy Flanagan serves as the Infrastructure and Engineering Services Manager for Reclamation's Great Plains Region, headquartered in Billings, Mont. Flanagan is responsible for providing professional and technical services and oversight for the safe operation of the region's project facilities including storage and diversion dams, power and pumping plants, canals, aqueducts, pipelines, tunnels, roads, bridges, recreation sites, buildings, water treatment plants and associated features.



Dan Fritz

Daniel S. Fritz serves as the Resource Services Program Manager for the Great Plains Region located in Billings, Mont. Fritz is responsible for the region's environmental compliance, land and resource services, water resources and planning and hydrology. He ensures compliance with environmental laws, regulations and policy management.

Maureen Wambeke is the Regional Chief Information Officer for Reclamation's Great Plains Region located in Billings, Mont. Maureen manages the information technology for the nine-state Region. This includes IT security, certifications and accreditations activities, implementation of new technology, and upgrades and maintenance of new and existing technologies.

Shelley R. Ruff is the Financial Manager for the Great Plains Region, the largest and most ecologically diverse region in Reclamation. Shelley is responsible for the development and analysis of strategic plans, operational plans, and associated performance indicators. She is responsible for the prudent management of all the financial resources of the Region.



Tyler Johnson

Tyler A. Johnson is the Regional Public Affairs Officer for the largest and most ecologically diverse region in the Bureau of Reclamation, including all or parts of nine Great Plains states. In this position, Tyler has overall responsibility for the region's public information (media relations), community relations and internal information programs and is responsible for managing the agency's strategic communications efforts.

Dan Jewell

Dan Jewell is the Area Manager for the Bureau of Reclamation's Montana Area Office based in Billings, Mont. Jewell provides leadership for the Montana Area Office which consists of the area office located in Billings, Montana, and three Field Offices: Canyon Ferry, Yellowtail, and Marias/Milk Rivers.



Coleman Smith

Coleman Smith is the Area Manager of the Wyoming Area Office, Great Plains Region in Loveland, Wyo. He is responsible for the management of the Boysen, Glendo, Hanover-Bluff, Kortez, Owl Creek, and Riverton units of the Pick-Sloan Missouri Basin Program. He is also responsible for the oversight of the Shoshone Project in the Bighorn River Basin, and the North Platte and Kendrick Projects in the North Platte River Basin.



Mike Collins

Michael P. Collins is the Area Manager for the Eastern Colorado Area Office based in Loveland, Colo. He manages and operates over a hundred features of water delivery and power-generating facilities in eastern Colorado for municipal, domestic and recreational use.



Aaron Thompson

Aaron Thompson serves as the Nebraska Kansas Area Manager based in Grand Island, Neb. He represents the Great Plains Regional Director with various private, public and government stakeholders, pertaining to the management, development and protection of water and related issues. He carries out these responsibilities with a 50-person employee workforce managing Reclamation projects in Nebraska, Kansas, and a portion of eastern Colorado.



Mark Treviño

Mark Treviño is the Area Manager of the Oklahoma-Texas Area Office, which includes most of Texas, all of Oklahoma and southern Kansas, making the area one of the largest geographical areas within Reclamation. As the Area Manager, Trevino is responsible for 11 Reclamation projects, which provide municipal and industrial water to over one million people. He also oversees significant recreation, fish and wildlife, and flood control benefits to the people of Texas, Oklahoma and Kansas.



Richard Long

Richard Long is the Area Manager for the Bureau of Reclamation's Dakotas Area Office headquartered in Bismarck, North Dakota with additional offices in Rapid City and Pierre, South Dakota. Long oversees all aspects of planning, construction, operation and maintenance, resource and land management, fish and wildlife, and environmental matters involving the management, development and protection of water and related resources in the Dakotas. Long's office is also involved with U.S.-North Dakota/Canada international transboundary issues.
