Chandler (Chan) P. Worley, Jr. serves as the Acquisition Services Program Manager for the Great Plains Region, headquartered in Billings, Montana. Worley is responsible for the Region's procurement functions, the financial assistance program, as well as property and records management. In his capacity as the senior contracting official for the Region, Worley is the Chief of the Contracting Office (CCO).

As the CCO, Worley provides leadership for all Regional procurement functions, meeting a wide range of client needs including, but not limited to; acquisition of supplies and services, research and development, environmental analyses, architectural and engineering services, cadastral surveys, photogrammetric mapping, professional and consultant services, construction, and the use of Interagency Acquisitions for unique services from partner federal agencies. Chan also oversees all aspects of property and records management for the Region.

Worley began his tenure as a Federal Civil Service employee with the GP Region as the CCO in February 2000. Prior to that, he was in private industry for 10 years as a senior acquisition and contracts manager, providing services to the U.S. Air Force for development, testing, and production of an array of precision guided weapon systems, including air-launched cruise missiles. Worley was a career U.S. Air Force officer, retiring in 1989 with more than 20 years of service, including a combat tour in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam War.

During his time with Reclamation, Chan has received numerous performance awards recognizing his valuable contributions to GP Region mission success in the areas of contract awards and financial assistance.

Worley earned a B.S. degree in Physics from Delta State University, Cleveland, Miss., in 1968. He completed the masters program in Meteorology at Texas A&M, College Station, Texas, in 1970, and earned a Master's Degree in Public Administration from the University of West Florida, Pensacola, Fla., in 1989. Worley also received a Masters Certificate in Government Contracting from George Washington University, Washington D.C. in 2006.
