

Dam Worker Loses Fingers On Hand

Sam Flynn, who is employed by Six Companies Inc., as a steel worker, had his left hand so badly mangled Sunday that all the fingers were later amputated.

Flynn, it is said, was working at the lower plug on Arizona tunnel number three, helping to unload a load of steel. Apparently he lost his balance and took hold of the cable to steady himself, and the cable is said to have carried his hand into the seaves, or pulleys.

John Thames, laborer for Six Companies Inc., was struck by a piece of falling timber Saturday while working at the upstream Nevada intake tower. Thames is suffering from a fractured left arm and a lacerated face.

Weldy Dana, who was injured at the same time, is a patient at the Boulder City hospital with a fractured right foot.

John Sparr, Jr., laborer for Six Companies Inc., is a patient at the Boulder City hospital with an infected knee. Wallace Deweese, employed by Six Companies Inc., as a carpenter, has an infected right hand.

Charles Willis, who is a laborer for Six Companies Inc., sustained a fractured right foot on Sunday.

Elmer Ham, laborer for Six Companies Inc., so badly mangled the first finger on his left hand Sunday, that the finger was amputated. Ham is also suffering from an injured foot.
