

DAM WORKERS WHO LOST LIVES ON PROJECT TO BE REMEMBERED

Bronze Plaque to Be Dedicated on Memorial Day, Planned

Boulder Dam workmen who have lost their lives during the construction of the giant project will be remembered on Memorial Day, May 30, when members of the Boulder City Central Labor council meet to dedicate to them a huge bronze plaque which is now being built to be placed on the Boulder Dam structure.

R. W. Oliver, chairman of the council's memorial committee, said today that a meeting of the Nevada State Federation of Labor had been called in Boulder City and Las Vegas for May 30 and 31, at which time delegates to the meeting would assist in the dedicatory ceremonies. Oliver said today that delegates from California councils of the various labor organizations were expected to attend the services.

Senator Pat McCarran, who has been working with the memorial committee to secure government sanction of the undertaking, has been invited to attend the occasion as special speaker. Oliver said this morning that McCarran has accepted the invitation, and would be present. California's Senator Johnson, and Governor Richard L. Kirman, have also been invited to participate. Further invitations will be sent out this week, Oliver stated this morning.

Construction of the memorial tablet was begun some time ago, and is progressing very rapidly. The molding and other preliminary work is nearing completion, and the tablet is to be ready for government approval in a short time. As soon as the approval of the government is obtained, the casting of the tablet will be begun. This part of the work and the actual finishing and dressing will
