

Bill to Correct Dam Fight Drawn

WASHINGTON, May 13. (U.P.)—A bill to protect the legality of more than a score of public works projects in the west, was filed today by Senator Hiram Johnson, of California.

Johnson said in introducing the measure, designed to overcome the 5-4 decision of the supreme court on April 29 invalidating the Parker dam project in Arizona that it represented the judgment of Attorney General Cummings and PWA Director Ickes.

The effect of the court decision, it was said, would imperil such projects as the Grand Coulee dam and power plant unless remedial legislation was passed.

The Johnson bill, it was indicated, would receive prompt congressional approval.
