

FIRST DEFINITE DRAFT OF LAWS FOR AUTHORITY AT DAM FINISHED

Will Be Submitted to Legislature at an Early Date by Kirman

CREATE COMMISSION

Congressional Comments
To Guide Permanent
Framing of Act

First definite draft of the legislation designed to set up the machinery whereby the state of Nevada can withdraw and resell its share of Boulder dam power to consuming industries in the state under proper regulations and restrictions, was completed in Carson City late yesterday afternoon, and will be submitted to the legislature at an early date by Governor Kirman, together with a message covering various phases of the Boulder dam setup.

A preliminary outline of the legislation was drafted in Las Vegas by a committee from the chamber of commerce headed by President A. S. Henderson, who, with Senator Key Pittman, drew the original act creating the Nevada Colorado river commission, and it was around this measure that the final act was built.

THE LOCAL committee, consisting of Henderson, Ed. W. Clark, A. C. Grant, James H. Down and A. E. Cahlan, met with Governor Kirman, Attorney-General Gray Mashburn, George W. Malone, state engineer and secretary of the Colorado river commission, and the Clark county legislative delegation in conferences on the proposed measure, and the ideas of various leaders in the legislature and in public life in the northern part of the state were sought.
