

JOHN C. PAGE TO TAKE POST IN WASHINGTON

B. C. Engineer Named Assistant to Dr. Elwood Mead in Capital

John C. Page, office engineer for the bureau of reclamation, Boulder canyon project, left Las Vegas yesterday morning by plane for Washington, D. C., where he will, temporarily, assist Dr. Elwood R. Mead, reclamation commissioner.

Walker R. Young, construction engineer of this project, said today that Page would be back in Boulder City, it was understood, before he would be occupied in the capitol permanently. Young said that the office of assistant reclamation commissioner had not yet been created, and that he had received no definite information concerning the position.

Robert S. Calland, associate engineer in charge of the designing department of the Boulder canyon project, will take over Page's duties until his return or until some definite move is made, Young said. Young also said that no move would be made to fill Page's position as office engineer here until it was definitely known that Page would remain in the capitol city.

Mrs. Page said that Page left Las Vegas yesterday morning at 1:30 o'clock and arrived in Washington at 9 o'clock last night, reporting for duty this morning. Mrs. Page said that if the position in Washington were permanent that she and their daughter, Miss Mildred Page, student in the Boulder City schools, would go there to make their home.
