

Colorado River Is Decreasing in Flow

Colorado river recordings made at Bright Angel by the bureau of reclamation took an unexpected and unexplained drop this morning when the readings showed a decrease of from 105,000 second feet yesterday morning to 95,000 second feet this morning.

The lake is now at elevation 878, which is seventeen feet below the intake towers, and is seventy three miles long. The lake covers an area of 32,500 acres of land with a 3,000,000 acre footage of water. This is declared to be approximately ten per cent full of water by volume, and covers about twenty-five per cent of the acreage to be under water.
