

Noted Column Writer Guest Of Dam Firm

Arthur Brisbane, probably the most widely read columnist in America, paid his first visit to Las Vegas and Boulder Dam today, as the guest of Six Companies officials.

Brisbane left his ranch at Hodge, California, early this morning, with Harold Anderson, of Anderson Brothers Supply company, operators of the huge mess hall that feeds the Boulder dam workmen, and arrived in Boulder City shortly before noon.

He had lunch at the mess-hall, eating the same meal as that prepared for the workmen, and left immediately with F. T. Crowe, general superintendent of the project, Norman Gallison, head of the public relations department, and Anderson, for the river, on a personally conducted tour of the works of the great project.

He will leave late this afternoon with Anderson as his pilot, for his ranch at Hodge, California, and the results of his observations are expected to be broadcast thruout the United States thru the newspaper syndicate in which his features appear.

Brisbane's trip to the dam site came as a result of an invitation issued by Gallison a short time ago, to come and see the project for himself.

Arriving just after lunch had started in the great messhall, Brisbane was promptly introduced to Superintendent Frank T. Crowe and other officials of Six Companies at the officials' table.

The famous editorial writer immediately commenced hurling a barrage of questions at Crowe, asking about wages, the recent strike, the size of the reservation, how many cabbages, spuds and turnips are used a day in the huge mess-hall, and other matters of importance and interest.
