

# Senate Again Puts Okeh On Hatchery Plan

A determined last-minute battle to secure approval for the proposed \$60,000 appropriation for construction of a fish hatchery in southern Nevada to stock Boulder lake, was being staged by Senator Pat McCarran in the closing hours of congress, according to word received here today.

The \$60,000 item was added to the second deficiency appropriation bill by the senate, but knocked out in conference by the house. The same item was approved by the senate Saturday night, when offered by Senator McCarran and is one of the points of difference between the two houses to be ironed out in conference.

The Nevada senator is optimistic concerning approval by the house conferees, but in a wire this afternoon, states that congress may adjourn without acting on the third deficiency bill itself, due to a serious controversy on matters pertaining to loans on cotton and wheat.

"In any event," McCarran says in his wire, "I am sure that we will secure the necessary sum for installation of the hatchery from other sources or at the next convening of congress.

"I am determined to succeed in this matter eventually," he concludes.

This hatchery would be built by the bureau of fisheries and would be in addition to the one now under construction by FERA under the direction of Claude Mackey, local director.
