

8 Persons Rescued From Boulder Lake

Eight persons were rescued from drowning in Boulder lake last month by Alfred L. Straub, bureau of reclamation life guard, according to Chief Ranger W. H. Trimble.

Several of the eight were made helpless by cramps, and the others simply swam beyond their strength, Trimble stated this morning.

Police department records show, also, that during the month of September 8,887 persons, of which 3,001 were children, enjoyed bathing in Boulder lake by actual count. The record takes in only, however, the hours between 12 o'clock noon and 8 p. m., when the life guard is on duty. First aid was rendered to 35 persons during the month, the largest number of whom sustained superficial cuts from buried cactus plants and other debris.
