

Vegas Power Plea Is Being Argued

Hearing of the application of the city of Las Vegas for an allotment of Boulder dam power occupied the Nevada Colorado River commission throuout the day yesterday, and was continued this morning, according to press reports from Carson City.

The application was protested by the Southern Nevada Power company on the grounds that the applicant had no distributing system, press reports stated.

The city was represented at the hearing by Mayor L. L. Arnett, commissioners H. P. Marble, M. E. Ward and J. H. Down, Sr., City Attorney Ryland G. Taylor, and special engineering counsel, Barry Dibble.

The power company was represented by Ed W. Clark, president and S. J. Lawson, manager.

Clark, who is a member of the commission, disqualified himself to act in the matter, and the issue will be decided by the other four commissioners who are: Governor Richard Kirman, State Engineer A. M. Smith and A. J. Caton and C. F. DeArmond.
