

4 STATE USE OF POWER IS URGED

SALT LAKE CITY, Nov. 6. (U.P.)
—E. F. Scattergood, chief engineer and general manager of the bureau of power and light for the city of Los Angeles, conferred with Governor Henry H. Blood Monday on a proposal to get representatives of four western states into a conference on the use of Boulder dam power.

Scattergood would have the governors of California, Utah, Nevada and Arizona appoint representatives to study ways and means of making power generated at the huge government project available to the people of the four states.

The Los Angeles engineer told Governor Blood he would submit a statement on his plans within the next few weeks. The governor said that after receiving the statement he would submit the problem to the state planning board or some other agency, and until he had received a report from the board or other agency he could make no commitment on the attitude of the state.
