

Eyes of Nation Turning on Nevada Because of Cheap Power, Tax Ease

That the entire nation is turning its eyes toward Nevada because of its tax laws, was revealed this morning by A. C. Grant, state planning board representative at the recent Chicago conference, upon his return home.

"Wherever I went I was questioned about Nevada's tax laws, and I talked to several representatives of large business concerns," Grant said.

"This tax question is becoming an increasingly important one all over the country, and the fact that Nevada has not exacted income taxes, inheritance taxes, or any of the other so-called nuisance levies is attracting plenty of interest.

"Couple that with the availability of cheap power at Boulder dam, and you have a combination that is clicking in the

minds of many manufacturers. I was surprised but very much pleased with the reaction we're getting, and I believe from the sentiments expressed to me, it will be the definite cause of many industries locating in this area," Grant concluded.

The sessions of the planning board representatives, who came to Chicago from 36 states, were most interesting and instructive Grant said.

"This state planning board business is a new thing, but one that seems to be definitely taking hold thruout the United States," Grant said, explaining the purpose of the meeting. "The Chicago conference was called for the purpose of swapping ideas, with each group very much interested in what the other states were doing. It was well attended and should be very resultful."
