

BUSINESS POLICY AT BOULDER CITY IS WORKED OUT BY DAM OFFICIALS

Soliciting in Dormitories
Being Investigated by
Big 6, U. S. Men

CONFERENCE HELD

Government Folk Explain
Their Stand on Matter
To the Public

A definite policy governing the transaction of business within the Boulder Dam reservation by outside agencies is being worked out by officials of the reclamation bureau and Six Companies, and will be announced within the next few days, it was learned this morning.

This policy has to do particularly with the matter of soliciting, delivering and collecting in the dormitories housing Six Companies employes, which has been under fire for several days past since the Las Vegas chamber of commerce discussed the matter in open session last Tuesday.

AT A CONFERENCE held this week between bureau of reclamation representatives and Six Companies officials, it was definitely decided to bar all solicitors from the dormitories.

This could not be allowed, government officials pointed out, for various reasons, it being pointed out that workmen are asleep in the dormitories at all hours of the day and night and do not wish to be awakened; that this must be done to safeguard against use of soliciting schemes by liquor dealers and that it would lead to frequent pilfering of the rooms. This is never allowed on large construction projects, it is pointed out.

DELIVERY OF laundry and cleaning for outside concerns will be allowed in the dormitories, by representatives of responsible concerns, it is stated, but the matter of mailing collections is still under discussion. A full statement of this policy will be forthcoming within the next few days, it is stated.

Many of the concerns now operating in the Boulder City area are concessionaires who will have offices of their own in the new government town in the near future, eliminating much of the cause for dissatisfaction which has made itself apparent of late.

MEN LIVING in Six Companies dormitories have the privilege of entertaining visitors in their rooms, it is pointed out, but no women are allowed in the dormitories.
