

# Messhall of Six Companies Turns Out to Be

One of the most complete and modern messhalls in the country today, one which has been publicized by photos in the press of the entire nation, is the Six Companies messhall conducted by Anderson brothers in Boulder City.

Visitors from all over the world marvel at the wholesale methods of handling foods there for serving of as many as 1100 men at one time.

The messhall feeds workmen and officials on the project, more than 3,000 men being served daily for about 6,000 meals and lunches in addition.

Great care is taken by Anderson brothers to maintain the utmost cleanliness, dishes being sterilized by high powered steam and electric dishwashers, and automatically dried.

Fresh fruits and vegetables are served to the men at every meal, all the perishables are brought in by refrigerator trucks every few days. Milk is furnished the messhall by a dairy which the Anderson brothers maintain so that fresh milk can be brought to the hall every day. In the neighborhood of

300 gallons of milk are brought in daily.

Because of the day and night shifts, meals are served at all hours, and in addition standard lunches are given the men working at the river.

The latest of kitchen equipment is used in the kitchen. Ovens, and ranges of a size worthy of the number of people served daily.
