

# Woman Leaps Out Of Auto, Is Injured

Will a leap last night from the rumble seat of a traveling automobile, following a family quarrel, result in the death of Mrs. R. A. Spencer, wife of a Six Companies Inc., employe?

And did she try to hurl herself under the wheels of an approaching machine, in an effort to take her own life?

Mrs. Spencer, who lives with her husband at the Boulder City auto court, lies today in the Boulder City hospital, with fractured skull and numerous injuries about the body, without having regained consciousness after her fateful plunge at 11 o'clock last night.

Spencer and his wife, together with six others in their party, had gone to Railroad Pass, to attend a dance. While there the couple engaged in an argument, according to others present, and left the place for Boulder City.

Mrs. Spencer entered the car of "Doc" Parsons, and was riding in the rumble seat with Mrs. Parsons. Claude Moore occupied the front seat with Parsons. Spencer is said to have boarded another machine.

The Parsons car had passed through the reservation gate and was about a mile from Boulder City, when, according to other oc-

cupants of the car, Mrs. Spencer jumped from the seat and landed in the highway. The car was traveling at the rate of about 30 miles an hour, according to Parsons. A second auto, traveling at about 40 miles an hour, was approaching from the rear. It is not thought that she was struck by this car, but sustained her injuries when she fell.

Parsons stopped his car immediately after the woman jumped and hurried her to the hospital.
