

Six Companies Pays Taxes Tomorrow

Tomorrow morning Clark county will complete the largest single financial transaction in its history, when J. F. Reis, administrative manager for Six Companies Incorporated delivers a check for the sum of \$182,650.79 in full payment for 1931, 1932 and 1933 taxes of the Boulder dam contracting firm and its subsidiary companies.

Reis was advised late this afternoon by attorneys for the company that all legal technicalities standing in the way of final payment of these taxes had been cleared away, and that he was at liberty to issue the check.

F. C. DeVinney, county assessor, upon being notified, left immediately for Boulder City to adjust a few minor matters that remained to be taken care of and Reis said the check would be delivered in the morning.

According to DeVinney this will be the largest single check ever paid in to Clark county.

All pending actions in the tax suit which was instituted last year, were dismissed in the federal court in Carson City yesterday thru stipulation of Attorney-General Gray Mashburn and Six Companies attorneys, following the reaching of a compromise agreement concerning the amount of taxes some weeks ago between Clark county commissioners, the district attorney's office and Six Companies attorneys.
