G. D. McIsaac Almost Instantly Killed on Job Yesterday

G. D. Isaac, rigger for Six Companies Inc., met almost instant death late yesterday afternoon by electrocution. McIsaac, according to all reports, was pulling a cable when the cable slipped from his grasp and connected with the power feed of the pump line in front of the downstream end of the dam.

The accident occurred shortly after 3 o'clock, and artificial respiration was given for a period of nearly one hour in an attempt to resuscitate McIsaac.

The deceased man, who was 37 years of age, had been employed on the Boulder dam project since March 1, of 1932. He was unmarried, and is survived by a brother, J. F. McIsaac of St. Peter's Bay, Prince Edward Island, Canada. McIsaac was an ex-service man.

The remains are at the Park's Mortuary, Boulder City, pending funeral arrangements.
