

# Reynolds Death Is Said Accidental

The coroner's jury early last evening brought in the verdict of death caused by accidental drowning in the case of William Reynolds, 27 years of age who was drowned in the vicinity of the gravel pit, approximately nine miles upstream from the Boulder dam after the heroic attempts of three others to save him.

The remains were this morning put on a train in Las Vegas to be sent to Reynold's birthplace and former home, Monroe, Utah.

Reynolds is survived by his brother, Dan Reynolds, who was nearly drowned in an attempt to rescue his brother William; by a brother-in-law residing in Boulder City, Frederick Coffin; and by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. James G. Reynolds, of Munroe. Reynolds had been an employe of the Bureau of Reclamation in Boulder City since June, 1930, and was rated in the civil service department as a senior laborer.
