

PWA Staff to Be Decentralized Now

WASHINGTON, May 14. (U.P.)—Public Works Administrator Ickes today ordered immediate decentralization of his staff to speed action on the \$10,000,000,000 in PWA applications expected in the \$4,000,000,00 work-relief drive.

He ordered about 10 lawyers, 50 engineers, 25 finance examiners and a horde of trained stenographers to be transferred from Washington to state PWA headquarters "as quickly as possible."
