Are Injured Today

Three accidents were reported at the Boulder dam project today, March 13, one of them, at least, being of a serious nature.

C. W. Bingham, Six Companies form mover foreman, was seriously hurt when a form fell on him, pinning him to the concrete on top of the structure. According to reports, the form slipped off the hook on one of the cables and fell on Bingham, pinning him, face down, on the concrete.

The man was so badly injured that it was impossible to take any X-ray pictures and just how seriously he is injured could not be determined. It is believed however, that his hurts are not fatal.

The only known injuries were two or three fractures about the face.

Carl Mudlin, Babcock and Wilcox laborer, suffered a fractured foot, but details of how the accident occurred could not be learned.

Ben Jones, concrete worker for Six Companies, suffered knee injuries this afternoon in an accident at the river, details of which were not given out.
