

# Dam Men Hurt As Concrete Sprays Them

Five Boulder dam workmen, working at the bottom of the slot thru the center of the dam structure itself, were variously injured yesterday afternoon, when one of the big eight-yard buckets, swung from cableway number five, and carrying concrete for the car which transports it into the slot for pouring, missed the opening of the hopper into the car, came open, and showered twenty tons of concrete onto the men working below.

The injured included: Willis Judkins, carpenter, suffering from head injuries; Charles Sweeney, carpenter, fractured toe; Watt Maxwell, carpenter, head injuries; Chet Owens, laborer, slight leg injury.

Sweeney was the most severely injured, but his condition is not serious, according to attending physicians. A fifth worker who figured in the accident was only slightly bruised and his name was not learned.

Two others were also hurt yesterday, James Byrne suffering a fractured ankle, and Ray Duni-vent being badly bruised when he fell while at work in one of the diversion tunnels. Details of Byrne's injury were not available.
