

Shriners Parade In Boulder City

Shrine candidates, wearing women's clothing or other disguise, paraded through the streets of Boulder City this afternoon, as a part of the mock initiation which is preceding the serious rites to be performed at the upper coffer dam in the canyon this evening.

The parade was led by four silver cars of the state highway patrol and was escorted by members of the reservation police. The drum corps and band of the Kerak Temple of Reno, with members dressed in their colorful purple uniforms, members of the advance delegation from Al Malaikah Temple of Los Angeles and other Shriners participated in the parade.
