Miss Jean Page Bride At Home of Parents

The two year romance of Miss Jean Page and Cecil Killgore culminated in marriage last night, in a simple ceremony held at the home of the bride's parents, Mr. and Mrs. John C. Page.

Mrs. Page stated this morning that it was planned to have the ceremony today, but as Killgore arrived in Boulder City earlier than was expected, the marriage took place last night.

The marriage rites were read by the Rev. Ray E. Orr, of the Las Vegas Methodist church, with Miss Betty Jean Metzger, of Long Beach, attending the bride. Edward Mathews, of Hollywood, who was to serve as best man, was unable to attend.

Mr. and Mrs. John C. Page, the bride's parents, and Mr. and Mrs. J. R. Killgore, of Hollywood, parents of the groom, were present. The ceremony was read at 9:30 o'clock.

Mrs. Killgore was graduated from the Las Vegas high school in 1932, having come here in 1931 from Grand Junction, Colorado. Following a semester spent at Pasadena Junior college, Mrs. Killgore attended the University of New Mexico, where she was pledged to Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority. Mrs. Killgore returned from Hollywood several days ago after being featured in a role in the R K O production, "Silver Streak."

Killgore was graduated from Cal-Tech in the class of 1932, where he majored in electrical engineering. During college, Killgore was president of Pi Kappa Delta fraternity and was prominent in school social circles. Killgore also belonged to the Kappa Gamma social club. While in Boulder City, Killgore was employed in the laboratory of the Bureau of Reclamation, and afterwards employed by the Babcock and Wilcox company. He left last fall and has been employed in the electrical designing department in the Denver office of the Bureau of Reclamation.

Mr. and Mrs. Killgore left last evening to spend several days at the Page home in Norie, Colorado, after which they will make their home at 1100 East Fourteenth street, Denver.
