DAM WARNING

Men seeking employment should stay away from Hoover Dam.

That is the warning issued by C. M. Feider, general representative of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, who is visiting in San Francisco.

Feider, who has just returned from a personal inspection of conditions at Hoover Dam, has this to say:

"There is no work for mechanics or laborers at the Hoover Dam project. While the contract has been let, preliminary work will not start for ninety days. Thousands of applications for work are on file. More than 2000 unemployed men are already on the ground vainly seeking work. Relief agencies are taxed to the limit in feeding and housing the unemployed men, who have been lured there by crooked employment agencies and real estate dealers who are flooding the country with misleading propaganda. Thousands of workers have already been victimized."

A similar warning and statement of conditions has been issued by the United States Department of Labor.
