

Truck Driver Hurt In Boulder Crash

Harold Kiggins, employed by Six Companies Inc., as a truck driver on the Boulder dam, sustained serious injuries Sunday night when the truck which he was driving slipped over an embankment at the dam. The accident happened about six o'clock. Kiggins was rushed to the hospital for treatment where it was found that he suffered from multiple fractures of the knee cap, spine and ribs.

Kiggins has been employed on the dam since May 4th, residing here with his wife and family.
