

DAM HIGH SCALERS, PICTURESQUE MOB, MAKE LAST STAND

High-scalers, a vanishing race on the Boulder Canyon project, are now making their last stand. The high-scalers were the most colorful workmen during early construction phases of the giant reclamation job. Paens of praise have been written about the daredevils whose work compelled them to be suspended on ropes hundreds of feet above the Colorado river, scaling the loose rocks from the sides of Black Canyon.

Ten or twelve of the picturesque workmen, dubbed Boulder dam's acrobats, are now employed in scaling off an 87-foot cut thru which the new Boulder-Kingman highway will run, linking southern Nevada with Arizona, via Boulder dam. The big cut is situated behind the tailtowers of cableways five and six.
