

TWO HIGHLINES AT DAM WILL BE TAKEN OUT SOON

Cableways Five and Six To Be Dismantled by Six Companies

Two of the few remaining landmarks of the Boulder canyon project, in use since early construction stages, are soon to disappear. Cableways number five and six are to be removed to the Bonneville, Oregon, project, where they will be utilized in the building of the Bonneville dam by the Columbia Construction company.

Cableway number five, before its removal, will install the girders to form the bridges leading from the two downstream intake towers to the dam. After the bridges have been completed, number five rig will be disassembled. Work is to start on the erection of the two bridges within the next few days, according to officials of Six Companies Inc.

CABLEWAY NUMBER six is, at present, being used to complete the four intake towers. From number six, also, the last pours needed to complete the Boulder dam structure will be made. A small amount of concrete will be transported to the Arizona side by number six in order that the Arizona spillway may be completed.
