

DAM MEMORIAL PLAQUE RITES TO BRING NOTED

An elaborate program, which will bring noted statesmen, labor leaders and other officials to Boulder City, is being planned by the Boulder City labor council for May 31, Memorial day, when the memorial plaque, erected in memory of those who gave their lives that Boulder dam might rise, is unveiled for the first time on that date.

Senator P. A. McCarran, Nevada's junior senator, will fly to Boulder City from Washington, to be present at the ceremonies, it was announced today, and there was some indication that William Green, president of the American Federation of Labor, might be able to be present at the ceremonies.

Governor B. B. Moeur, of Arizona, has been invited to attend the services and there is some assurance that he will be present.

Governor Richard Kirman, of Nevada, will be unable to be present for the rites, but has delegated Charles Lee Horsey, prominent Las Vegas attorney, to represent him and the state of Nevada, at the Boulder dam ceremonies.

The plaque has been cast, it was announced today, and will be installed in the niche reserved for it in plenty of time to assure the unveiling by May 31.
