

# FEDERAL HELP OF PROSPECTORS URGED TO C. OF C.

## Boulder Dam Mining Association Urges Body to Aid in Drive

Seeking federal aid for prospectors, a committee from the Boulder Dam Mining association, appeared before members of the Las Vegas chamber of commerce at their weekly luncheon today and asked their help in pushing the matter thru.

Harry Trehearne, A. Smith, and Dan Jondahl, spoke on the subject and explained that such a program is being carried out in White Pine county through the federal relief office. Through correspondence with officials Hopkins and Upman they have indicated their willingness for the money to be so used. Claude Mackey, local relief administrator has withheld the money for such use, interpreting his instructions as to exclude such projects as grub staking prospectors, the speakers said.

**MAKING FUNDS** available for prospectors will relieve the situation in carrying for many "unemployables," who are old time miners and still are willing and anxious to work if given the chance, Jondahl reported.

Members of the chamber of commerce voted today to send a display of Boulder dam photographs, samples of highline cable and other articles to R. C. Stitser of Winnemucca, who left here today to attend the National Editorial association convention in New Orleans, where more than 1200 editors and publishers will meet next week.

A **PROGRAM** by the "Lady About Town" will be broadcast at noon tomorrow from station KSCJ and will be devoted to information concerning the Boulder dam, it was announced today.

A free movie showing the construction and erection of the power lines will be presented by the Los Angeles bureau of power and light at the Elks hall at 8 o'clock Friday night and will be shown in the high school Friday afternoon.

**IT IS** planned that the Metropolitan Water District will have a display of the Boulder dam at the San Diego exposition, Secretary Goerman announced.

Plans for the construction of a municipal swimming pool in the city park are progressing, it was reported by O. W. Yates, chairman of the committee. Water for the pool will be obtained from the irrigation ditch, and actual construction of the pool is being delayed subject to the new federal relief setup.
