

# BOULDER CITY'S RAINFALL BROKE ALL MARKS; 2.43 INCHES RECORDED

Tuesday's Precipitation Is  
Greatest of the Present  
Storm

More rain has fallen on Boulder City this year, 1935, than at any other time for the months of January and February, according to records of the bureau of reclamation.

A total of 1.31 of an inch has fallen this month, making the total for January and February, so far, 2.43. On Wednesday, the rainfall amounted to .26: on Tuesday, rainfall was .95, and on Monday, rain fell to the amount of .10. Today's fall had not been recorded up to a late hour today, but it is expected that it will break the preceding records.

**MEN FROM** the dam and powerhouse were unable to work day shift on the Boulder canyon project due to the unusually heavy downpour.

Rainfall for January amounted to 1.12 inches, or nearly 1-3 of the average annual precipitation recorded in the last three years, according to a report made by the bureau of reclamation.

**THE COLORADO** river was reported to be flowing this morning at the rate of 5,500 cubic feet per second. Last night's flow showed a total of 5,550 cubic feet per second.
