

# PAT McCARRAN SAYS PART OF RELIEF MONIES WILL BE USED

Administration Leaders  
Give Nevada Solon  
Promise of Cash

## BATTLE IS WON

Junior Senator Wages  
Hard Battle to Gain  
Ends He Desired.

Availability of funds for construction of power transmission lines in the state of Nevada from the \$4,880,000,000 work-relief bill now pending before congress was assured to Senator Pat McCarran by administration leaders late yesterday, according to telegraphic dispatches to the Review-Journal last night.

These funds will be available for counties, municipalities and other political subdivisions for the transmission of Boulder dam power to interior points in the state, Senator McCarran was assured.

ALTHOUGH DEFEATED in that part of his fight which would have enabled communities to obtain loans for acquisition of existing power plants, when an amendment supported jointly by Senator Bone of Washington and McCarran was defeated, the Nevada senator was given outright assurance that political subdivisions in the state will be able to secure sufficient funds to transmit Nevada's share of the Boulder dam power into the interior.

POINTING OUT the futility of spending hundreds of millions on power projects such as Boulder dam while the power generated could not be used because communities generally might be unable to finance the transmission of power to their doors, the Nevada senator managed to gather a majority of sentiment behind him.

In order to forestall the other half of the amendment permitting loans for the purchase of existing power plants out of work funds, administration leaders assured Senator McCarran that funds to bring the power into the state would be available.

"THE REST of the amendment wasn't so important," McCarran said. "I got the things I really wanted, namely, definite assurance that Nevada cities and towns would be able to obtain their share of Boulder dam power."
