

TOURIST TRAVEL TO DAM STILL AHEAD OF 1934

Increase Noted in First
Six Month of Year Still
In Effect

Tourist travel to Boulder Dam in September continued to hold slightly more than a 50 per cent lead over 1934, figures released this week by the bureau of reclamation disclosed.

A total of 31,266 persons in 10,106 cars checked in at the gate to bring the total for the year to date well above the entire number of visitors for 1934.

THE BIG rush was recorded on the twenty-ninth and thirtieth, when 6,610 out of state visitors joined the throng that welcomed President Franklin D. Roosevelt to the dedication ceremonies, with 1,380 visitors in 449 cars arriving on the twenty-ninth and 4,846 in 1,243 cars being checked in at the gate on the thirtieth.

A total of 384 in 96 cars took advantage of the opening of the highway across the dam to come in from Arizona, the figures showed.

SEPTEMBER'S TOTAL of 31,266 is 11,017 in excess of the same period in 1934, representing an increase of 54.5 per cent for the month. It brings the total number of visitors for the year to 293,731, some 28,303 more than the 265,428 total recorded for the entire year 1934.
