

Dam Worker Misses Death in Crash

J. Randall, Boulder dam worker and employee of the Six Companies in the power houses, is in the hospital today as a result of injuries sustained when his car turned over because of a blown out tire.

The accident happened about nine o'clock Wednesday morning in the eastern part of Las Vegas as Randall was returning from work on the dam.

He was treated first in Las Vegas and then sent to the Boulder City hospital where he now is when advised that X-ray pictures would be necessary to determine the extent of his injuries. Co-workers who were also returning from work that morning went to his aid at the time of the accident and returned with him to Boulder City.

According to Dr. Schofield, Boulder City hospital head, Randall has a fracture and dislocation of the vertebrae of the spine with temporary paralysis of the left arm, although it is expected that the arm will resume its normal state as soon as the patient is able to move around. Randall, his wife, and three children are residents of Las Vegas.
