

# FLOW OF RIVER STILL DROPPING

The flow of the Colorado river into Boulder lake continued to drop off today with only 83,400 second feet being recorded at the official measuring station, as compared to 95,000 yesterday.

The highest point reached in the spring runoff was on Wednesday of this week when the total was reported as 105,000 second feet.

The lake is still rising at the rate of between three and five feet per day and is now 74 miles long, reclamation bureau officials said.

At the present rate, the waters should reach the lower level of the intake towers about Tuesday of next week.

Water is still being released for Imperial valley and other irrigation districts below the dam at the rate of 17,000 second feet.
