

MORE EQUIPMENT TRANSFERRED TO BONNEVILLE JOB

Number Six Cableway Is Sent From Boulder Job To the Northwest

More equipment from the Boulder dam was transferred to the Bonneville job yesterday, according to word released here today.

The number six cableway, which for the past year and one-half has been busily engaged on the project with pouring the huge amounts of concrete into the main structure itself, was sent yesterday to the Bonneville dam, at which place it will resume like operations.

Number five cableway was completely moved to Bonneville on April 25 and it is expected that more of the cableway equipment will be sent on at a later date. Present plans for the transfer of equipment include the moving of several of the electric locomotives, commonly known as "dinkys" on Boulder dam, to Bonneville, as well as two of the large locomotive trains and one of the large type derricks.

Within a short time some of the eight cubic yard buckets in use for the placing of concrete will also be sent north. Due to the late and gradual run-off of waters at Bonneville, it is expected that operations will not resume until September.
