

Injured Workman Moved to Mayo's

James T. Armstrong, one of the three Boulder dam workers who plunged through the Arizona spillway raise into the swirling waters of the Colorado river in one of the diversion tunnels two years ago, is being moved from the Loma Linda hospital in California to Mayo Brothers sanitarium in Rochester, Minnesota, his wife revealed today.

Armstrong was the most seriously injured in the sensational accident, and has been in the hospital ever since for treatment for a severe back injury.

Attending physicians hold out little hope for his recovery, but his brave wife is still optimistic, and is leaving no stone unturned to give him the very best of treatment.

The Masonic lodge is taking considerable interest in Armstrong's case, his wife states, and when he leaves for the east, he will be met at each stop by a delegation from the lodge of that city to be sure he wants for nothing en route.
