

Colorado River Is Showing Flow Boost

The Colorado river is showing slight rises in flow after establishing the lowest level of the year, 5,690 cubic feet per second, on Friday, September 13, reclamation bureau engineers stated today. Yesterday the river was running at the rate of 6,320 cubic feet per second; today's report from the Bright Angel checking station shows the flow to be 6,640 cubic feet per second.

Boulder lake today, showed a drop of .65 feet over Friday's report, lowering the surface to elevation 923.8. Water at the rate of 10,100 cubic feet per second is being released thru diversion tunnel one.
